

### **History & Museums**



#### 1. Columns Plantation

2 mi. east of intersection of SC 327 & Old Marion Hwy., 669.6730 This antebellum home was built in the 1850's on the Harwell Plantation and is listed on the National Register of Historic Places. The property is the last working plantation in the area and is the site of the annual reenactment of the "Skirmish at Gamble's Hotel," a local Civil War battle, held the first weekend in March. Exterior visitors welcome. Group interior tours by appointment.

# 2. Florence Museum of Art, Science and History

558 Spruce St., 662.3351 www.florencemuseum.org This interesting museum will enlighten visitors to the history of Florence. It contains a changing art gallery, Asian collection, African artifacts, ancient Mediterranean civilizations, natural history and pueblo pottery. Open Tues.-Sat., 10 am-5 pm; Sun. 2 pm-5 pm. Admission \$1.



3. Hewn-Timber Cabins at Francis Marion University - Wallace Woods Rd. on the east side of Francis Marion University campus, 661.1311, www.fmarion.edu Listed on the National Register of Historic Places, these are the remaining two of eight cabins, circa 1836, that were built by African-Americans. The hewn timber cabins are open and available to the general public from 10:30 am to 2:30 pm on the second Wednesday of each month from March through November, weather permitting. Other times, signs outside each cabin provide visitors with a wealth of information.



# **4. National Cemetery** 803 E. National Cemetery Rd. 669.8783

This cemetery was established in 1865 as a burial place for the Union soldiers that died while being held at the Confederate stockade here. The first woman to be buried in a National cemetery, Florena Budwin, is buried here. The cemetery contains the remains of veterans from all major US conflicts.



### 5. Railroad Museum

Irby St., beside City-County Complex, 662.3351 Florence began as a railroad junction in the mid 1800's and was a major rail center for the movement of men and military supplies during the Civil War. This museum is housed in a renovated box car and caboose and is filled with hundreds of artifacts and photos. Contact the Florence Museum for guided tours.



# **6. War Between the States Museum** – 107 S. Guerry St., 669.1266

This museum showcases local life in the area during the 1860's. Exhibits include artifacts from various battles, camp sites, photos and household items. It also houses a scale model of the Florence stockade and artifacts from the C.S.S. Pee Dee, the only commissioned Naval vessel built in the area. Open Wed. and Sat., 10 am-5 pm.

Admission: Adults-\$2, Children-\$1
